Behaviors for success

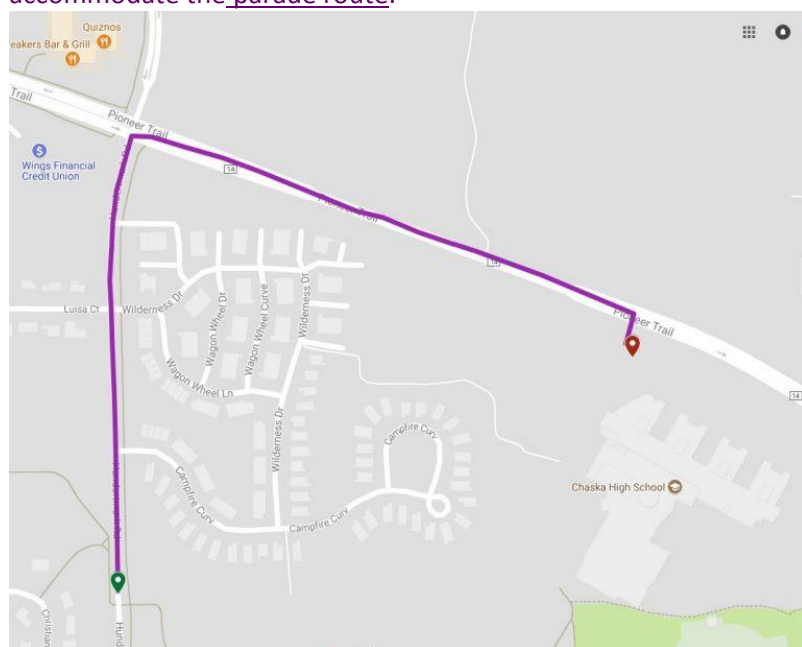
For the first time at the high school we will be reporting on behaviors that support learning. Each department at CHS choose two different behaviors to have students reflect and to report on this year.

Chaska High School has Two National Merit Semifinalists

Congratulations to Kayla Lyman and Austin Wu who have been named as semifinalists for the 2018 National Merit Scholarship Program.

Semifinalists are selected based on scores they received on their PSAT test last October and represent less than 1 percent of high school seniors nationwide. Kayla and Austin are in the running to earn scholarship money. Over 7,000 scholarships worth more than 32 million will be awarded between April and July 2018.

Did you Know?:

Picture Retake Day is Friday, October 6th

If you need to have your picture re-taken, you may do so on October 6th. Your original picture packet must be given to the photographer at the time of the re-take. This is the last chance to have pictures taken for the school year.

New & improved Chromebook insurance: Full coverage for the same low price

Eastern Carver County Schools offers a damage waiver Protection Plan to defray the cost of replacement or repair of district Chromebooks. This plan is an optional purchase. It covers accidental damage, liquid damage, fire, flood, theft, natural disaster and power surge due to lightning. Theft is covered with a police report. Without the protection plan, families are responsible for the full cost of Chromebook repairs or replacement. **Starting this school year, the Protection Plan covers three incidents of repairs or replacement.**

The cost is \$25 for coverage from the date of purchase through the summer of 2018. This protection must be purchased prior to any incident of damage or theft of the Chromebook for 2017-18 school year. For families that have more than one Chromebook, a maximum of \$50 will be charged to cover the multiple devices (Families with more than one Chromebook should go online and sign up for two insurance purchases. For each additional child, contact the tech associate in the student's school to request insurance be added for him/her). [Purchase your protection plan now!](#)

Internet monitoring report now available to families

As part of our commitment to ensuring safe and effective use of technology, parents/guardians can now view a report of all web traffic on their student's Chromebook.

- Look for an email summary report from support@securly.com.
- Or you may also logon to the [Securly web portal](#) anytime using your email address. *First time users, enter your email address and click "Forgot Password?"* to get an initial password.
- Eastern Carver County Schools monitors all internet access from any device that connects to our network at school, including personal devices. However, the district cannot and does not monitor personal devices outside of school. There is no report available for a personal device used at school.
- In the [Securly web portal](#) you have the option to permit/restrict Internet access when your student's Chromebook is away from school. You have the option to block additional categories of websites along with specific sites. You are not able to change site which have been blocked by the district or change blocked categories.

College Knowledge Month



October is College Knowledge Month. Once again Chaska High School will be participating in this state-wide initiative to help students with thoughtful college exploration and planning. A variety of presentations and activities will be planned throughout the month of October to get students excited about and support them in planning for their futures. Check out some of the things we will be doing:

- Every Tuesday students and staff are encouraged to wear college gear. *(After the month of October staff are still encouraged to wear college gear on Tuesdays and Chaska Hawk spirit wear on Fridays during the school year)*
- Take a picture of yourself on a campus college visit anytime during the month of October and tweet it or email it to the CRC and be entered into a prize drawing for college gear @ChaskaHighCRC or halvorsont@district112.org
- College visits at Chaska High School: College Admissions Representatives from a variety of colleges and universities visit the CRC each week. They are available to meet with students to share application, academic program, housing, campus life and financial aid information with prospective students. - A number of MN colleges do not charge an application fee at any time, but during College Knowledge Month other schools waive the application fee for the whole month of October and some for just the last week of October. Please note that most schools across the country have fee waivers available throughout the year for qualifying students. For a list of participating schools and fee information, click [here](#). We strongly encourage seniors to complete college applications by Nov. 1 since this date is becoming a more common deadline if you want to be considered for scholarships at the colleges you are applying to.
- All 10th graders will take the Pre ACT on Tuesday, October 10.
- The PSAT will be administered on Wednesday, October 11 for those 9-11 grade students who have pre-registered.
- There will be a FREE bus to Hennepin Technical College for their evening open house on Wednesday, October 11. Permission forms are available in the CRC and on the CRC website.
- Attend the District Financial Aid Night, Tuesday, October 17, 6:30-7:30pm in the Chanhassen High School Theater. You can now start filling out and submitting the [FAFSA](#) on October 1, 2017 using your 2016 tax information – www.fafsa.ed.gov - use the FAFSA Date Retrieval Tool to make the process smoother when you complete your FAFSA.
- MCIS information sessions – Come learn how to use the Minnesota Career Information System that your student uses for career and college exploration. Counselors will demonstrate how to do occupation, college and scholarship sorts and much more during conferences in the CRC.
- WIN Sessions – Counselors will be available in the CRC during WIN time throughout the month of October to assist students and share information about applying to college, college essays, college visits, 2 & 4 year colleges/programs, MCIS training, ACT prep/tips and activity resumes. Students can sign up to be in the CRC during WIN in the flex scheduler.
- Military Fair – Tues. Oct. 24 in the CHS Commons during lunch. Representatives from a variety of branches and organizations will be available to share information and answer questions about military opportunities.
- “Oportunidades para estuديات Latinos” – October 25 during WIN (9:33-10:18) - This event will provide first generation Latino students and their parents with a better understanding about college and resources available. This includes valuable information on applying and paying for college. The presentation will be communicated in Spanish by Javier Salinas Vega from Normandale Community College. All students and parents are welcome to attend.
- October 27 -Senior Application Celebration Day! All seniors will be given a pass from one of their teachers to come to the media center to do one of the following: (we will have college admissions representatives, counselors and parent volunteers hanging out in the media center all day assisting students)
 - 1) Sign the CHS Senior College Knowledge Month Poster declaring they have a plan for next fall and receive an "I've Applied" bracelet and then head back to class.
 - 2) Sit down at a computer and fill out a college application and/or get help answering any questions about the college application process.
 - 3) Meet with a counselor to set up a meeting to discuss career/college goals.

As always, please encourage students to talk with their counselors or stop by the CRC for additional support and resources. Thank you for being a part of this exciting exploration, planning, and applying time for our students.

LETTERS OF RECOMMENDATION

If a college application or scholarship application requires letters of recommendation - and **many do not require any at all** - most often they are looking for one from a recent core academic teacher (english,

science, math, social studies) and/or your counselor. If you do need a letter of recommendation, please make sure to give the writer plenty of time to create the letter and to get it to its destination before the deadline. Many CHS teachers or counselors will ask you to turn in the "SENIOR RECOMMENDATION REQUEST & INFORMATION FORM" which gives them a better idea of who you are outside the classroom. A copy of the form can be found here: <https://goo.gl/QMb3F0> This form can also be a good resume template for all students - a good way to keep track of activities, jobs, interests, etc. Although a teacher may return a letter of recommendation to you, typically the letter is submitted without the student seeing it first. Here is a good recommendation letter checklist:

- Fill the form out once and make copies if you need to give it to more than one recommender
- Give the teacher/counselor at least two weeks' notice
- Fill out and give teacher/counselor completed senior recommendation form
- Arrange a pick-up or mail by date
- Provide an addressed, stamped envelope if needed
- Send a Thank you note to teacher/counselor

COLLEGE VISITS AT CHS

College Admissions Representatives from a variety of colleges and universities visit the CRC each week. They are available to meet with students to share application, academic program, housing, campus life and financial aid information with prospective students. Students can sign up for the visits in the flex scheduler.

ACT/SAT

Act and SAT tests are offered throughout the year. Students can log on to ACT's web site, www.actstudent.org to register for their ACT test. To register online for the SAT test students should go to www.collegeboard.com. Students must upload a photo when registering for the ACT or SAT. Students are required to bring their admission ticket and photo id on the test day. No ticket, no photo id, no admission! As a general rule, we recommend that juniors start taking the ACT in the 2nd half of their junior year. However, some students are ready before that time and are certainly welcome to test earlier. One guideline is to wait until the student has either completed or has taken at least one semester of algebra 2. Students may take the tests as often as they choose. Official ACT and SAT scores can also be requested to be sent to a student's college(s) of choice through both of these test registration websites.

Notes from District 112:

All Children Should Learn to Walk by 1 Year of Age?

“All children should learn to walk by 1 year of age.” Does it seem odd that children would be held to a standard measurement such as this when each child is so different from one to the next? Some children learn to walk well before 12 months of age, while others are still crawlers as they near 18 months. Does it reflect on the child's future walking and running skills throughout his or her life? Most likely, no. The late-walker may not be up on two feet by one year, but he or she may be developing rapidly in other ways. By the age of three, it may be impossible to see a difference in a child who walked at 9 months of age and another who didn't walk until 18 months. [Read more here.](#)

New district giving campaign coming in November

The District 112 Foundation is a non-profit organization separate from the school district with an independent board of directors. For the first time in the district's 112 years, the foundation will sponsor a charitable giving campaign. The foundation's goals include supporting student activities, reducing students' economic insecurity, building an alumni association and creating an endowment fund. Residents of Eastern Carver County Schools will be asked to consider supporting the District 112 Foundation in November. Watch your mailboxes for more information on how to support the foundation. Remember, the District 112 Foundation is separate from Eastern Carver County Schools — individuals have a choice whether to give to the foundation.

One way **your students** benefit from the District 112 Foundation is through teacher grants. Individual teachers and staff apply for funds from the foundation. Supporting for the District 112 Foundation goes directly back into our schools (*this is only a short list!*):

- *Bluff Creek Elem.*: BizTown, Junior Achievement program for elementary students; standing student desks
- *Carver Elem.*: Phonological awareness (reading support)
- *Chanhassen Elem.*: Needed library books, including non-fiction, informational texts
- *Chanhassen HS*: Stream water study (Science Department), technology for students with disabilities, drama program support
- *Chaska HS*: A 3D printer; learning stations for the engineering department
- *Chaska Middle School East*: FitnessGram for personal wellness, books reflecting global literature, technology for reading for students learning English, classroom audio systems, portable collaboration stations, support for the orchestra program

- *Chaska Middle School West*: Media Center books to suit various interests, equipment for the school's broadcast studio, support for the orchestra program, DNA Detectives (Science Department), classroom audio systems, technology for students with disabilities
- *Clover Ridge Elem.*: Non-fiction reading materials, and an individualized reading program
- *East Union Elem.*: Advanced novels for students in grades 3-5, a leveled reading library
- *Jonathan Elementary*: iPads for reading support, literature for students with special needs, books for classroom libraries
- *Integrated Arts Academy*: audio and multimedia production equipment
- *Kinder Academy*: Leveled reader books
- *La Academia*: Support for Makerspace; Osmo iPad systems for the Curiosity Cafe
- *Pioneer Ridge Middle*: Ridge Video creation station tools, musical instruments, support for students struggling in math, classroom audio systems
- *Victoria Elem.*: Support for art classes, books to teach empathy and prevent bullying behavior
